





Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Each year, on the Third (3/3), Fourth (3/10), & Fifth (3/17) Sundays of Lent, we celebrate the Scrutinies at the 11am Mass.

The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good.

Please pray for our **ELECT**, that the Lord delivers them from the power of sin and Satan, protects them against temptation, and gives them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life.

The Elect will receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, 3/30.

Fasting + Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Why is there no music at the end of Masses during Lent?

During the Lenten season at St. Luke's, the Mass usually concludes with a silent Recessional: the Priest, Deacon, and servers process out of the church with no music. Why, you might ask, do we do this?

In the Mass during Lent, the Church parallels much about Christ's journey into the desert. Jesus went out into the desert for forty days to be silent and fast from earthly goods like food and drink in order to prepare for His public ministry.

The rubrics of the Roman Missal prescribe greater austerity and silence in Lenten Masses in order to promote this spirit of penitence and reflection. The communal singing of Recessional hymns and the playing of organ postludes have their place, but Lent is a time of simpler and quieter celebration. Having a silent Recessional, while not the only option allowed by the rubrics, is well-suited to this spirit of the Lenten season.

40 Hour Lenten Adoration / Devotion to Start off Holy Week

St. Luke's will have a 40-hour Lenten Adoration devotion to start off Holy Week.

This period of prayer will begin on **Monday**, **March 25th** at **12:30am** with Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Adoration for 40 consecutive hours in the Church. Adoration will end with Benediction on Tuesday, March 26th at 4:30pm prior to the 5:30pm mass.


