Reflection on the Fourth Sunday of Easter

The fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In each of the three lectionary cycles, our Gospel is taken from the 10th chapter of the Gospel of John. In Cycle B, we hear the middle verses of this chapter. Unless we consider this chapter in the greater context of John's Gospel, we will miss the radical nature of the statement Jesus makes when he declares himself to be the Good Shepherd.

The concern of a good shepherd for his sheep is part of the shepherd's job. Jesus says, however, that the actions of the good shepherd are based upon the relationship that develops between the shepherd and the sheep. This is at the heart of the difference between the good shepherd and the hired shepherd. The good shepherd knows the sheep and therefore acts out of love. For the Good Shepherd, this is never simply part of a job; this love-in-action is integral to his identity.

What is sacred music, and why is it important?

The Second Vatican Council stated: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as sacred song united to the words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy." (Sacrosanctum Concilium, §112) Pope Pius XII

Sacred music is the greatest of the arts associated with the Liturgy because it not only adorns the Mass, but is an integral part of it. This treasure of sacred music is a treasure meant to be shared. Catholics deserve to hear and worship with sacred music drawn from

this treasury. What we sing at St. Luke's is a portion, albeit a small one, of this great body of beautiful sacred music that has been handed down to us.

Sacred music means more than **singing** at **Mass**, it most properly means **singing** the **Mass**. One way we try to do this at St. Luke's is to sing the Entrance and Communion Antiphons, which are the texts prescribed by the Church for specific liturgies. The Church has handed down Gregorian Chant settings of these antiphons. We sing these Latin chant settings occasionally, but more often we sing modern English chant versions.

While the rubrics allow for other music selections (such as hymns) at these times, the first preference is given to these Antiphons. The texts are often related directly to the readings of the day, or more indirectly when they draw out other meanings and connections within Scripture. Consider taking some time to meditate on the Antiphons along with meditating on the readings of the day.




