Saint Athanasius of Alexandria | Catholic Saints



What are the Qualities of True Sacred Music?



Pope St. Pius X (r. 1903-1914)


In his encyclical on sacred music, Tra Le Sollecitudini (1903), Pope St. Pius X described the three qualities that sacred music should have: sanctity, goodness of forms, and universality. He goes on to describe in more detail what is meant by each quality:

sanctity - "It must be holy, and must, therefore, exclude all profanity not only in itself, but in the manner in which it is presented by those who execute it"

goodness of forms (also described as beauty) - "It must be true art, for otherwise it will be impossible for it to exercise on the minds of those who listen to it that efficacy which the Church aims at obtaining in admitting into her liturgy the art of musical sounds".

universality - "it must, at the same time, be universal in the sense that while every nation is permitted to admit into its ecclesiastical compositions those special forms which may be said to constitute its native music, still these forms must be subordinated in such a manner to the general characteristics of sacred music that nobody of any nation may receive an impression other than good on hearing them"

The writing is somewhat antiquated and can be confusing, so over the coming weeks we'll unpack each of these qualities to gain a better understanding of what Pius X is talking about. As a preview of where we're going, here is what Pius X says is the kind of music that best exhibits these qualities: "These qualities are to be found, in the highest degree, in **Gregorian Chant**, which is, consequently the Chant proper to the Roman Church" (§ 3). Reflection on the Fifth Sunday of Easter

Today's Gospel reading is taken from middle of the Last Supper discourse. Jesus speaks about his relationship to his disciples. In his metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is referencing the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and Yahweh himself tends the vineyard. One of the primary themes of John's Gospel is to show Jesus to be the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel.

In this passage, Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death; he will remain with them always. This unity between Jesus and his disciples is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that he began. Similarly, Jesus' presence with us through the Gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to continue the work of love and reconciliation that he began.

Jesus also teaches his disciples about the importance of the words he has taught to them. Just as Jesus will remain in the disciples, so too will his words. We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the living Word of God. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. This commitment is also strengthened by our life of prayer and nourished by the Eucharist. Through the Eucharist, Jesus dwells in us, remains with us, and transforms us so that we might bear fruit in his name.




