

Reflection on the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel begins with a report that the Jews complained about Jesus' claims regarding his identity. They knew his family, and they knew he was the son of Joseph. They could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said that he came down from heaven. Jesus responds to the complaints by saying that only those who are chosen by God will recognize him as the one that God sent. This is a recurring theme in John's Gospel, that God has chosen those who will have faith in Jesus.

In the verses that follow, Jesus talks more about his unity with the Father. He is the one who has seen the Father and, therefore, knows the Father. Those who listen to God will recognize that Jesus is the one sent from God. Those who believe will have eternal life. Jesus concludes with the central element of our eucharistic theology. He promises that the bread of life will bring eternal life to those who partake of it, and he tells us that the bread of life will be his own flesh, given for the life of the world.

In today's reading, we hear Jesus say again, as he did in last week's Gospel, that he is the bread of life. We also hear Jesus add that he is the living bread. Both of these statements help us understand better the gift that Jesus gives us in the Eucharist. We celebrate this gift of Jesus each time we gather for Mass. We believe that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist will lead us to eternal life.





Reflection on the First Reading, 1 Kings 19:4

Setting the Scene for 1 Kings 19:4



In 1 Kings chapter 19, we find the prophet Elijah in a moment of deep despair and exhaustion. The scene is set on Mount Horeb, also known as Mount Sinai, a place of great significance in biblical history. Elijah, a powerful and zealous prophet of the Lord, had just experienced a great victory over the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. However, Queen Jezebel's threat on his life had sent him fleeing into the wilderness.

As Elijah sits under a broom tree, weary and disheartened, he cries out to the Lord, feeling utterly alone and ready to give up. The weight of his mission and the constant opposition from those who sought to harm him had taken its toll. In this moment of vulnerability, an angel of the Lord appears to him, providing him with food and water, strengthening him for the journey ahead. This scene captures the raw humanity of a great prophet, showing his struggles and the Lord's compassion towards him in his time of need.

What is 1 Kings 19:4 About?

When we are faced with overwhelming challenges and feel like giving up, it can be easy to lose hope and pray for things to end. Elijah sought death as a way out in this verse, showing a moment of despair. But God, in His infinite compassion and wisdom, did not give Elijah what he asked for. Instead, God provided sustenance to nourish his body and guidance to uplift his spirit.

Relevance to Contemporary Life

Elijah's experience speaks directly to the struggles many people face today. Responsibilities, stress, and feelings of inadequacy can easily overwhelm individuals in our fast-paced society. Elijah's willingness to express his despair to God teaches us the importance of being honest about our emotions and seeking divine support in our lowest moments. This is particularly relevant in today's world where mental health issues are prevalent, and people often feel isolated in their struggles. A young professional achieved great success but felt utterly overwhelmed and contemplated giving up. This individual, much like Elijah, retreated into solitude, feeling abandoned and exhausted. However, through prayer and reaching out to a supportive community, they found the strength to continue. This mirrors Elijah's story, reminding us that even in our darkest times, seeking help and turning to faith can provide the strength we need to persevere.

The Responsorial Psalm & the Gregorian Chant Gradual

In the Lectionary and Source & Summit Missal, we find the texts of the Responsorial Psalm that we are all familiar with. Before 1970, the text used at the equivalent place in the Mass was called the **Gradual** (Latin *graduale* or *responsorium graduale*). And while the texts of the Responsorial Psalms are often different from the Graduals, both remain as legitimate options to be sung at Mass (see General Instruction on the Roman Missal, 61). In some upcoming Masses, we plan to sing the Gradual instead of the Responsorial Psalm, so here are a few things to know.

The format of the Gradual chant is a little different. There are two sections, the **Respond** and the **Verse**. The Respond is sung once, the one Verse follows, then the Respond is usually repeated.


The Gradual is usually a short Scriptural text, but it is sung to many, many notes in a technique described as *melismatic*. This slow, melismatic character of the Gradual is meant to foster **meditation** on the text.

Because the Gradual is musically much more complex than the Responsorial Psalm, it is not intended for congregational singing. In these parts of the Mass in which the congregation does not join in singing, the congregation can take that time to listen and meditate and so to participate.

and men who have been wounded by abortion to find healing and peace. There is a support group beginning in the Triangle area in late September.


