





Active Participation (Part 2)

Last week, we covered a few quotes from Vatican II that employ the term "active participation." Today, we will spend some time unpacking the term.

Active participation is more than just singing a song at Mass. It begins as an interior disposition, in which we offer ourselves in union with Christ's gift of Himself to the Father. This interior disposition is then sometimes expressed by our exterior actions: standing, kneeling, speaking, singing, etc. Active participation can also include listening, as when we listen to Scripture, the homily, and the choir. At times, we express this participation by singing those hymns and chants designated for the congregation.

And while congregational singing is a very important part of sacred music, a large part of the Church's treasure of sacred music is not necessarily accessible to congregations due to the difficulty and complexity of the music. Such music would have to be sung by experienced choirs.

Some Gregorian chants, however, especially Mass Ordinaries, are very approachable for many congregations. Pius XI even stated in 1928 that a reason for the revival of Gregorian chant was to encourage congregational active participation (see *Divini Cultus*, 9). As a way both to draw on the Church's sacred music treasury and to encourage active participation, here we sing the Gregorian chant Mass VIII (*Missa de Angelis*) and parts of Mass XVI and XVIII.

Reflection on the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

In this Gospel, Mark addresses the question of which Jewish practices would be observed in the newly emerging Christian community. This was a significant question for the early Christian Church, especially in communities that included both Jewish and Gentile converts to Christianity. We also hear this question addressed in the letters of Paul with regard to table fellowship. In Gospel passages such as the one today, we see the Gospel evangelists finding justification for a Christian practice distinct from Judaism in the remembrances of Jesus' teaching and the practice of his first disciples.

Mark also provides a significant amount of information about the Jewish observance of ritual-purity laws. Most scholars believe that Mark includes this information because his audience includes Gentile Christians who have no knowledge or experience of these laws. We can infer, therefore, that many in Mark's community were not Jewish Christians.

If we read today's Gospel carefully, we will see a pattern in Jesus' teaching method that will be repeated in the weeks ahead. Jesus' first teaching is directed to the Pharisees who questioned him. Jesus' words are then directed to the crowd, teaching that a person is defiled by his or her words and actions, not by the food that he or she eats. The words we read at the conclusion of today's Gospel are addressed to Jesus' disciples. Mark's narrative shows several audiences for Jesus' teaching: his antagonists, the crowds, and Jesus' disciples. As we see in this reading, the words to the Pharisees are often words of challenge. The teaching to the crowds is often a general, sometimes cryptic, message. With the disciples, who often misunderstand Jesus' words, further explanation is offered about his message and its meaning.

Jesus' words challenge us as well. In our desire to show that we are holy, we might also give too much credence to externals, following rules without thinking of the intention behind them. Jesus reminds us that we do not make ourselves holy by our actions. Rather, we become holy when we allow God's Spirit to transform us. Our actions should express the conversion of our heart to God and to God's ways.

They are very easy to use.

You basically put the earpiece on your ear, turn the little device on, and adjust the volume to your liking. Several parishioners have also found that their personal earbuds plug into the devices and work really well

They are available at each Mass by simply asking one of our Ministers of Hospitality to get one for you.

We have had several parishioners test these, including some of our seniors. They tell us that the earpieces provide excellent enhanced sound.
